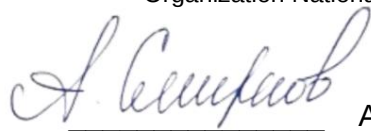

REGULATIONS

on holding the III International Festival

adaptive sports "IMPULSE"

International Inclusive Games 2026

I. General Provisions

The III International Festival of Adaptive Sports "IMPULSE" (hereinafter referred to as the Festival) is held within the framework of the implementation of the state program of the Russian Federation "Development of Physical Culture and Sports" and the Unified Calendar Plan of Interregional, All-Russian and International Physical Culture and Sports Events for 2026

The goals and objectives of the III International Festival of Adaptive Sports "IMPULSE":

III International Festival of Adaptive Sports "IMPULSE" (International Inclusive Games 2026) is a large-scale event aimed at promoting adaptive and inclusive sports and supporting people with disabilities.

The festival's objectives:

Goals are strategic guidelines that define general focus of the event:

Promoting inclusive sport: Create a platform where athletes with different abilities can compete on an equal footing, demonstrating that sport is accessible to everyone, regardless of physical limitations.

Raising public awareness: To draw the attention of the public, media, and government to the issues of adaptive sports, helping to change stereotypes and promote the integration of people with disabilities into society.

International cooperation: Bringing together participants from different countries to share experiences, strengthen friendships, and develop a global support network inclusive initiatives.

Inspiration and motivation: to motivate people with disabilities to take up sports by showing real success stories and overcoming barriers.

Developing adaptive sports: Stimulate the growth and promotion of sports adapted for people with disabilities, including Paralympic and special sports.

The festival is held with the aim of: - popularizing and promoting adaptive sports; - strengthening the health and physical development of people with disabilities health opportunities;

- mass involvement of people with disabilities in adaptive physical education and adaptive sports;

- promoting physical and spiritual education and rehabilitation disabled people by means of adaptive physical education and adaptive sports;

- activating the activities of organizations that carry out work on the rehabilitation, social adaptation and public integration of people with disabilities.

The festival's objectives:

Organization of competitions: hold tournaments in various adaptive sports, ensuring the participation of at least 2,500 athletes from 20+ countries.

Conducting educational and cultural events: organize Master classes, seminars, and roundtables on inclusion, rehabilitation through sport, and infrastructure accessibility, with the participation of experts and trainers.

Ensuring accessibility: Create conditions for comfortable participation for all categories of athletes, including adapted infrastructure, transportation, and medical support at venues in Sochi.

Monitoring and evaluation: collect feedback from participants, measure the festival's impact on public opinion, and prepare a summary for the further development of similar initiatives.

The IMPULSE Festival strives not only for athletic achievements but also to create a society where everyone can realize their potential. If you need additional details or assistance with preparation, please let me know!

These Regulations are the basis for sending athletes, coaches, judges and other specialists in the field of physical education and sports to the Festival.

II. Venue and dates

The festival will be held from March 26 to 29, 2026, at the following venues:

- Federal State Budgetary Institution "Yug Sport" st. Bzugu, 6, Sochi.
- Built-up, inclusive sports town Sovetskaya street, 26, Central microdistrict, Sochi (Navaginskaya square).

III. Competition organizers

The general management of the Festival is carried out by the International Inclusive Committee (hereinafter referred to as the International Public Organization "International Inclusive Committee").

The direct implementation is entrusted to the International Public Organization "National Inclusive Committee" of Russia and the chief judging panels for sports (hereinafter referred to as the CJC), approved by the Organizing Committee.

IV. Requirements for participants and conditions for their admission

Citizens of the Russian Federation, as well as citizens of foreign countries aged from 6 to 85 years, are allowed to participate in the Festival competitions.
persons with musculoskeletal disorders, visual impairments, hearing impairments, intellectual disabilities, cerebral palsy, participants and veterans of the Second World War who have been wounded and have disabilities, as well as those who have been cleared by a doctor to participate in competitions.

The basis for admitting a participant to sports competitions
The festival, according to medical reports, is an application for participation in sports competitions with the mark "Admitted" opposite each name, certified
the signature of the doctor and his personal seal, as well as the seal of the medical organization licensed to carry out medical activities that include work (services) in therapeutic physical education and sports
medicine.

Each participant has the right to take part in one sport, but in
several sports disciplines, according to the submitted application for participation.

Team composition – from 1 person.

The team may also include: a team leader, a doctor,
accompanying persons with disabilities of group 1.

Powerlifting

Athletes over 14 years of age are allowed to participate in powerlifting competitions for people with disabilities.

During the competition, the athlete takes a place on the bench press, If necessary, the judges secure it with one or two seat belts.

The athlete's task is to take the barbell with straightened arms, then lower it to chest, and then squeeze with mandatory fixation in the elbow joint.

The athlete is given three attempts, and the one who lifts the heaviest weight wins. If the athlete wishes to make another attempt to set a record, they are allowed a fourth attempt, but this does not count toward the competition score.

All exercises are performed on a square platform measuring between 2.5 and 4 meters. The platform surface must be flat, hard, non-slip, and horizontal, and it should rise no more than 10 cm from the stage or floor.

Additional disciplines for persons with intellectual disabilities (in development).

Powerlifting. Sport for people with intellectual disabilities. Powerlifting - triathlon - weight categories: 43, 47, 52, 53, 57, 59, 63, 66, 72, 74, 83, 84, 93, 105, 120 kg. Men and women aged 18 to 80.

Archery

The rules of the sport "adaptive archery" are regulated rules of the International Federation (FITA).

Classification groups:

W1 - athletes with impairments in the upper and lower limbs, most often those with spinal cord injury at the neck level;

W2 - wheelchair athletes with impairments in the lower limbs;

ST - athletes who can compete sitting or standing.

Distances. A classic bow is used for shooting at 18, 30, and 70 meters, while a compound bow is used for shooting at 18, 30, and 50 meters.

Use of assistive devices:

All assistive devices must comply with regulations and be checked by classifiers.

Paralympic archers use special devices to draw or release the bowstring, mouth clips, corsets, belts, supports, wheelchairs or individual chairs.

Wheelchair basketball

Wheelchair Basketball 3x3:

3x3 wheelchair basketball is played on one hoop by two teams of three players, each with a maximum of one substitute. Each team's goal is to score and prevent the other team from scoring. The game is controlled by up to two referees, table officials, and a sports supervisor (if present).

The first team to score 21 or more points wins the game if it occurs before the end of regulation. This sudden-death rule applies only during regulation (not during potential overtime). If the score is tied at the end of regulation, overtime must be played. The first team to score two points in overtime wins the game.

Darts

Individual competitions are held separately for boys and girls in the "Standing" and "Wheelchair" categories in the "Single Competition" discipline. Athletes perform five qualifying attempts of three throws. Hits in the "Double" and "Triple" sectors

are counted. If the scores in the individual competition are tied, competitors are given an extra attempt (three throws) to determine their placing.

Sailing

The competition is a team competition and is conducted in accordance with the rules of the sport of sailing, as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing WS (PPG-25). Scoring system – linear.

Men and women over 18 years of age, as well as young men and women under 18 years of age who have submitted an application for participation in a timely manner and agree to the terms and conditions of the competition, are allowed to participate in the competition.

Participants under 18 years of age are allowed to participate in the Competition only in accompanied by parents or guardians.

The competition is held in the following qualifying groups: - inflatable sailing catamarans (STPK) - men, women.

The goal of the race is to successfully complete the race distance without breaking the rules. time established by the regulations.

The catamaran crew must consist of at least two people, of which at least one has a disability.

A competition is considered completed after one race. If fewer than five races are held, participants' series points will be equal to the sum of the points scored in all races. If five to eight races are held, participants' series points will be equal to the sum of the points scored in all races, excluding the one worst result. If nine or more races are held, participants' series points will be equal to the sum of the points scored in all races, excluding the two worst results.

Arm wrestling

Persons not younger than 18 years of age (men and women) with the necessary sports training may participate in the competition.

Competitions are held either sitting or standing. Athletes compete on a chair. without armrests or in a wheelchair.

The athlete can optionally be secured with straps to the backrest or seat chair (stroller).

The athlete has the right to place any support under the buttocks, not while allowing the support to be placed on the legs.

Violations of the rules include falling from a chair (wheelchair) or touching the floor with a hand (for example, when breaking a grip). In this case, the athlete is given a warning warning.

At the weigh-in, athletes with disabilities must be weighed first. Mobility aids (leg prostheses) and life support devices (arm prostheses) are considered body parts and are taken into account when weighing competitors.

During a fight between disabled athletes, an assistant (coach) wearing appropriate sportswear is allowed onto the stage to insure the disabled athlete from behind.

The use of a wheelchair, chair or other device for seated wrestling is prohibited for disabled athletes participating in competitions among healthy athletes in a standing position.

Winners and prize winners are determined among men and women in each weight category.

Judo

Judo competitions for the blind are held in accordance with the rules of the International Judo Federation, with some modifications approved by the International Blind Sports Federation (IBSA).

Sambo

The competition is held in accordance with the rules of the International Sambo Federation.

Taekwondo

The competition is held according to the rules of the International Adaptive Taekwondo Federation with additions from the Adaptive Taekwondo Federation of Russia. Competition program: - pair performances; -

demonstration set of movements (individual)

Classic or Olympic; -

demonstration set of movements (team 2,3,4,5 and 6) Classic or Olympic;

- demonstration of jumping kicks; - demonstration of kick force (dynamometer);
- sparring matches (for people with hearing impairments).

Football

Athletes participate in the competitions in the following sports: "sports for the blind", "sports for the deaf", "sports for people with disabilities", "sports for people with intellectual disabilities", "football for people with cerebral palsy", among which the international inclusive tournament for the Impulse Cup is being held.

Sports competitions are held among boys and girls, young men and women aged 10 to 18. Games are played in

3x3, 5x5, and 7x7 formats. The winning team receives 3 points, the losing team receives 0 points, and a tie receives 1 point.

The International Inclusive Tournament for the Impulse Cup consists of athletes divided into teams. Each team consists of two groups: one for typical athletes and one for athletes with disabilities. The groups compete against each other: typical athletes against typical athletes, and athletes with disabilities against athletes with disabilities. Points are calculated based on the number of goals scored by both groups, and the winning team is determined by adding up the total points.

Boccia

The competition is held in the sport of "sports for individuals with musculoskeletal disabilities" in a single event—mixed pairs, regardless of sport class. The competition is held on a rubber surface. Participants must bring their own balls.

Bocce

Competitions are held in sports for people with intellectual disabilities. The team consists of 4 people.

The basic principle of the game: You must roll your ball as close to the pallino as possible. The opponent tries to roll their ball closer to the pallino than your ball. The game is played for a set time (10 minutes). The referee or players toss a coin onto the playing field to determine which player or team will throw the pallino and choose the color of the balls. The starting team (player) has three attempts to throw the pallino from the starting area into the field—the area between the center line and the opposite starting line. The team that wins the toss throws the pallino to start the game. The opposing team then throws the balls. The referee then determines the sequence of throws. A player must not start playing until the pallino or other balls have come to a complete stop. At the end of each frame, when all the balls have been thrown, points are awarded to the team (player) whose balls are closest to the pallino, which can be determined visually or by measurement. Only one team receives points in each frame. The maximum number of points in one frame is four. The final games are played in a round-robin format: win - 3 points; loss - 0 points. The final placement will be determined by the following criteria: the highest number of points in all final matches; the highest goal difference in all final matches; the highest number of goals scored in all final matches. If two or more teams are tied

Based on all these criteria, their placement will be determined by: the teams' personal record; the greatest goal difference between the teams; and the greatest number of goals scored in all final matches between the teams. The State Sports Committee reserves the right to make changes to the competition program.

Board games

The competition is open to individuals with musculoskeletal and visual impairments. The competition is held in the following board games: jaccolo and shuffleboard .

A player has three attempts to score 30 pucks into designated pockets. If not all the pucks are scored on the first try, the rebound pucks are re-shot (the order may vary depending on the game). At the end of each attempt, the pucks in the pockets are stacked so that they do not interfere with other pucks. The game ends after each player has completed all their attempts to score.

Shuffleball.

Players shoot pucks toward the end of the table, marked 1-2-3, until all eight pucks have been shot. This marks the end of the round. The player with the highest point total wins the round. If the points are tied, the player with the puck closest to the edge of the table wins the round. If there are no points scored in a round, the round is replayed, and the player who shot the puck last gets the turn. A player can shoot the opponent's puck to improve their puck position on the table and achieve a higher point total for the round. Winners are determined in each game of the Festival program, among men and women, based on the best score. Depending on the number of participants, the Grand Jury may make changes to the competition program.

Table tennis

The competition is open to individuals with musculoskeletal disabilities (classes TT1-TT10), hearing impairments, motor classes according to impairments, and intellectual disabilities. Participants with disabilities are classified into functional the table tennis classification system. The competition is held over three sets in accordance with the current international table tennis rules. The State Jury determines the competition system based on the number of participants. Participants must have their own sports equipment.

Karate

WKF sports classes are divided by age and gender (men and women). Sports classes for adults: 8 sports classes.

Individual Kata for Visually Impaired Athletes: Men +16 K10 and women +16 K10;

All athletes with visual impairments during the performance of kata It is necessary to wear blindfolds.

In the K10 class, the kata is performed standing. Individual kata for athletes with intellectual disabilities: men +16 K21 K22 and women +16 K21 K22.

In classes K21 and K22, repetition of one kata in each round is allowed. competitions. Kata must be performed standing.

Individual kata for athletes with physical disabilities development: men +16 K30 and women +16 K30.

In the K30 class, competitions are held in wheelchairs.

The Festival program will include demonstration performances in para-karate.

Adaptive Checkers

The competition is held using the Swiss system. The number of rounds depends on the number of registered participants. The time limit is 10 minutes per game for each participant.

Adaptive Chess

The competition is held using the Swiss system. The number of rounds depends on the number of registered participants. The time limit is 15 minutes per game for each participant.

Cheer sport

Cheer Inclusion Competition, PAIR OF

CHEER. Athletes on the autism spectrum (ASD) participate in the competition. "sports for people with disabilities", "sports for people with intellectual disabilities".

Age categories: mixed. Programs:

small teams, pairs, duets: URBAN CHEER, CHEERDANCE. Program duration: maximum 1 minute 30 seconds. CHEER: GROUP STANT.

Program duration: maximum 1 minute 30 seconds. Individual championship. Program:

CHEERDANCE, CHEER jumps, acrobatics.

Sitting volleyball

The competition is held between teams consisting of no more than 9 people, of which no more than 6 players can be on the court at any one time, including no more than 2 players with the sports class "NE",
the rest are spare.

The sitting volleyball competition is held in two stages. In the first stage, teams are divided into groups according to a draw. Group matches are played using a round-robin system. The second stage consists of playoff matches. The duration of the group stage game is three sets of up to two.

x wins, the game lasts up to 15 points. The game is won by the team that first scores 15 points with a lead of at least two points. In the event of a tied score of 14:14, play continues until a two-point lead is achieved (16-14, 17-15, etc.). If the game score is tied 1-1, the deciding third game is also played up to

15 points and a minimum advantage of 2 points. 1st and 2nd places will be determined based on the results of the group matches. Then, first place in Group A plays against second place in Group B, and first place in Group B plays against second place in Group A. The winners of these pairs advance to the match for first place, and the losers to the match for third. All playoff matches are played up to 2 (two) wins out of three sets, where the first two sets are played to 25 (twenty-five) points, and the third set (if necessary) is played to 15 (fifteen) points. If the score is 24:24 in the first two sets, the game continues until the difference in the score is two points, but no more than until one of the teams reaches 30 points. If the score is 14:14 in the third set, the game continues until the difference in the score is two points, but no more than until one of the teams reaches 20 points. Single participants will be declared for the regional team. The State Sports Committee reserves the right to change the rules of the competition at its own discretion.

VI. Conditions for summing up the results of the competition

The Festival's competitions are individual and team events. They are held separately for men and women, boys and girls, and girls and boys, with results being tallied in individual and team events.

The system for conducting competitions in disciplines is determined by the State Judicial Committee on the day of the admission commission after the participants have passed the admission commission and after completing the sports-functional classification.

Report of the Chief Judge of the Festival and final results (minutes) on paper and electronic media by the International Inclusive Committee within 10 days from the end of the Festival.

VII. Awarding of winners and runners-up

The winners and prize-winners of the Festival in individual and team events will be awarded medals and diplomas from the International Inclusive Committee (IIC), cups and belts in selected sports at the discretion of the organizer.

Gifts and prizes from sport partners are possible.

VIII. Financing conditions

The costs associated with the organization and holding of the Festival are borne by the International Inclusive Committee and the International Public Organization "National Inclusive Committee".

Group and specialized transfers will be provided for all participants and the festival, from the train station or airport in Sochi (Krasnodar Krai) to accredited hotels and back or to an agreed-upon stop.

Travel expenses for participants from their place of residence to the Festival venue and back, daily travel allowances, accommodation and meals are covered by the participants or sending organizations.

Costs for round-trip travel, accommodation and meals for participants

Teams from orphanages for the disabled and boarding schools for the disabled are welcome to participate in the festival, with funding from the National Inclusive Committee allocated to regions of the Russian Federation for these purposes.

The costs of transfer, accommodation and meals for foreign participants are covered by the funds of the International Public Organization "National Inclusive Committee", within the budget allocated for these purposes.

IX. Ensuring the safety of participants and spectators, medical and anti-doping support for competitions

Representatives and coaches are responsible for the life and health of participants during the Festival.

X. Insurance of participants

Participation in sports competitions is permitted only with a life and health insurance policy covering accidents, which must be submitted to the admissions committee for each participant. Insurance for sports competition participants may be provided by budgetary funds from the constituent entities of the Russian Federation or by extra-budgetary funds in accordance with Russian legislation.

XI. Applications for participation

Preliminary applications for participation in the Festival are submitted to the Organizing Committee at link <https://festimpulse.com/> by November 30, 2026 (Appendix 1).

Main (personal) and group applications for participation in the Festival must be submitted to the Organizing Committee via the link <https://festimpulse.com/> no later than March 15, 2026 (Appendix 2 and 3).

The following documents must be submitted to the participants' admission committee on the day of arrival:

- personalized applications for participation in the Festival (Appendix 2) separately for each discipline;
- clearance from a doctor;
- a copy of the passport or birth certificate;
- life and health insurance contract against accidents;

- a certificate from the medical and social examination (MSE) on disability;
- consent to the processing of personal data (Appendix 3).

Upon prior request, the Organizing Committee of the competition provides transfer of participants, including special buses equipped with Wheelchair accessible ramps. We also offer group transfers from V.I. Sevastyanov Sochi International Airport and Adler Train Station to and from an accredited hotel.

The International Inclusive Committee has the right to make changes to the regulations and additions to the rules of the competition and refereeing part.

All sports presented will be included in the program if teams from at least five regions of the Russian Federation and one foreign team are formed.

Sports may be added or changed at the discretion of the organizers.

The International Adaptive Sports Festival "IMPULSE" is being held as part of the implementation of national projects in Russia.
